We became a vision in 1976 when we realized how quickly an historic way of life was disappearing from the landscape. Now we are a rapidly growing reality as we create a living rural experience for people of all ages to see, touch and explore. Located on forty acres of rich Martin County prairie overlooking Fairmont's beautiful Lake Sisseton, we invite you to discover the many reasons the upper Midwest is called America's Breadbasket.

Providing food and fiber for the world family is an essential and vital industry deserving of recognition and preservation. Early pioneers came from northern Europe to settle in the vast heartland and their roots grew deep as their commitment to the land. In 1776, roughly 95% of the people lived on farms. Today less than 5% of our population is engaged in farming. Their efficiency feeds our entire nation at prices lower than any other place on earth and provides many of our country's leading exports as well.

We salute the farmers whose labors have enabled us to take food for granted. We are eager to share their story with you. Enjoy your visit to our farm. We hope to see you often.



The barn on the land is the only original building The chapel and depot came from Welcome, MN. The water tower was moved from North Dakota and the log cabin came from Windom, MN. The house & school came from Trimont, MN. The chicken house, blacksmith shop, granary, and grain elevator, have all been donated and moved in from the local area. The machine shed was built on the site.

The Prairieville building houses a 1940's Main Street, with a variety of stores and products from that era in time.



We also have a portable stage for performances, a kiddie train for the kids, a "people mover" for guided tours and golf carts are available to take you to and from your vehicle upon request.

In late 2015, Heritage Acres added a new 54 foot by 105 foot Morton building to the property, to be used for displays and storing some of the machinery donated to Heritage Acres. Donations from businesses, organizations, individuals and families helped pay for construction of this new facility.











The chapel can be rented for a wedding and the Prairieville building can be rented for meetings, etc. We do not rent for wedding receptions. No alcohol is allowed on the property and no smoking or animals are allowed in the buildings.

We are open by appointment and encourage bus tours and school children to tour our facility. All buildings are open during special events and are handicap accessible.
